Mostly refugees from National Socialism, about one hundred Austrians, among them ski stars and mountaineers, served with the 10<sup>th</sup> Mountain Division—the only unit in the U.S. Army of World II specialized in mountain warfare and operations in climatically extreme conditions. Their experiences, from training in a high valley in Colorado, to combat duty in Italy, to their postwar journeys, are currently in the focus of the Ludwig Boltzmann Institute for Research on the Consequences of War. A bilingual public outreach initiative supported by the U.S. Embassy in Austria will launch June 6, 2023, at Ehemalige Postsparkasse in Vienna with a guest lecture, insights into the ongoing research, and a pop-up photo exhibition.
